June 7, 2010
Monday 12:00 noon

The special session of the City Council, City of Vermillion, South Dakota was held on Monday, June 7, 2010 at 12:00 noon in the City Hall large conference room.

1. Roll Call

Present: Edelen, French, Hofman (arrived at 12:01 p.m.), Meins, Osborne, Powell, Willson, Mayor Christopherson

Absent: Ward

Mayor Christopherson requested a point of privilege to present a Corp of Discovery recognition to Dr. Cindy Brown for the photos she has taken during his tenure as Mayor.

2. Educational Session - "U-Town" Marketing concept - Jeff Baylor, USD

Jeffrey Baylor, USD Vice President of Marketing, stated that they are working with a marketing firm on a concept for marketing the community and university. Jeff presented a video on the "U town Vermillion" and asked the City Council for comments on the proposal.

Discussion followed on the presentation.

3. Educational Session - Proposal to rename Ratingen Strasse to University Street - Rich Van Den Hul and Roberto Ambur

Rich Van Den Hul, USD Vice President of Finance and Administration, reported that the proposal to change the street name has been in process for a few years. Rich stated that to assist potential students and parents in finding their way to the campus they would like to have them enter on University Street. They would drive by the Wellness Center and Coyote Village with the view of Old Main as they entered. The City transportation study conducted in 2004 recommended renaming the street to establish consistency in the north south streets.

Mayor Christopherson stated that notices of the proposal have been sent to the property owners adjoining the street and asked John Prescott to comment. John stated that the notice of the proposal to

change the street name was sent to property owners or managers and no comments were received.

Discussion followed noting that maybe the new plaza on Market and Main could be named the Ratingen Plaza to continue the recognition of our sister city relationship with Ratingen Germany. The consensus was to have City staff put the street name change and the naming of the plaza on a future agenda.

4. Educational Session - Proposal to remove parking along the east side of Rose Street - Rich Van Den Hul and Roberta Ambur

Rich Van Den Hul, USD Vice President of Finance and Administration, stated that the request is to remove the diagonal parking along the east side of Rose Street to increase the safety of the traveling public. He stated that Coyote Village student housing with 550 beds and the new parking lot with 682 parking spaces will significantly increase the pedestrian, bicycles and vehicles in the area. Rich stated that they have talked to the Newman Center about this and that the University is willing to work with sharing lots to assist them as University need is between 8:00 am and 5:00 pm Monday through Friday and the Newman Center need is evenings and weekends. The other change on campus is the removal of 200 parking spaces in the parking lot between the Muenster University Center and the Law School that will be replaced with the parking in the Coyote Village parking lot, thus creating more pedestrian traffic at Rose Street. Rich stated that the plan is to remove Cypress and Redwood housing units for parking but that will not be happening this year. Rich concluded noting that the request to remove the parking on the east side of Rose Street is for more visibility and safety.

Discussion followed on the reduction of 25 parking spaces on city street parking in addition to the 200 spaces on campus with the replacement spaces being further away from the Muenster University Center and campus. Jose Dominguez, City Engineer, reported that with the increased traffic some of the parking spaces close to Cherry Street will need to be removed to increase the visibility of the intersection.

Alderman Hofman requested to leave at 12:57 pm.

Mayor Christopherson noted that the City was notified that the South Dakota DOT has agreed to install a traffic signal at Rose and Cherry yet this year. In order to do this, the State is requesting that a sidewalk be installed on the west side of Rose Street. With the sidewalks on both sides of Rose Street, he questioned the need to remove the parking on Rose Street. After discussion, there was no

consensus to move forward with the removal of the parking on the east side of Rose Street.

5. Briefing on the June 7, 2010 City Council Regular Meeting Agenda

Council reviewed items on the agenda with City staff. No action was taken.

6. Adjourn

The regular session of the City Council, City of Vermillion, South Dakota was called to order on June 7, 2010 at 7:00 p.m. by Mayor Christopherson.

Alderman Edelen moved approval of the May 17, 2010 special session minutes, May 17, 2010 regular session minutes, June 2, 2010 special session minutes. Alderman Willson seconded the motion. Motion carried 9 to 0. Mayor Christopherson declared the motion adopted.

A. Responsible Fatherhood Proclamation

Alderman Meins read the Responsible Fatherhood Proclamation designating the month of June 2010 as "Responsible Fatherhood Month" in Vermillion.

B. Sidewalk Inspection Program information - City Engineer

Jose Dominguez, City Engineer, reviewed the sidewalk inspection program noting that the inspection area would be the northwest section of town. The inspection will include trippers of 1" between sidewalk sections, excess slope of $\frac{3}{4}$ " per foot, surface defects, excessive spalling, sections cracked into four or more pieces and 2' by 2' tiles. Jose noted that the areas for repair would be marked and a notice left at the property stating the need to repair. After completion of the inspections, a list of addresses in need of repair will be presented to the City Council for adoption of a Notice to Repair.

C. Alderman Osborne invited the community to a library expansion public input session to be held June 9th from 5:00 pm to 7:00 pm in the Council Chambers.

Representatives of the VCDC are present to answer questions.

Jose Dominguez, City Engineer, reported that in 2007 the City Council had a plan to complete sidewalks along major streets. City

staff has worked with the property owners along Crawford Road and all but one have completed their sidewalks. This resolution is at the request of the one remaining property owner who is out of town and wants the City to complete the sidewalk. This notice is to set a public hearing date of July 16, 2010 for resolution of necessity to complete the project.

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, by the Governing Body of the City of Vermillion, South Dakota, at a regularly called meeting thereof, in the Council Chambers of said City at 7:00 p.m. on the 7th day of June 2010, that the convenience and necessity has arisen for the construction of concrete sidewalks on the portion of the public streets and in front or abutting the lot or parcel of land hereinafter named:

The South 74' of the North 77' and North 73' of South 88' of Lot G of Block 1 of the East Half of the East Half of the Northeast Quarter of the Northeast Quarter of Section 19, T92N, R51W of the 5th P.M.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the general nature of the improvement shall be as follows:

The gravel cushion shall be 5-feet wide and compacted.

The concrete surfacing shall be 5-feet wide and 4-inches thick.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the materials to be used in the construction of said improvement shall be according to the specifications adopted by the City. The estimated assessment, excluding the fiscal fee, against the property fronting and abutting on said streets is as follows:

Concrete Sidewalk per front ft. \$17.60

The estimated assessments for concrete sidewalk are based on 2010 costs.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that when the cost of construction of the improvement has been determined, the Engineer shall calculate and report, to the Governing Body, the amount to be assessed against each lot or part of lot fronting or abutting upon the improvement. In determining such assessment, the Engineer shall divide the total cost of the improvement, less the City's share of the cost, by the number of feet fronting or abutting upon said improvement. The quotient, plus an eight percent (8%) fiscal fee, shall be the amount assessed, per front foot, upon the property fronting or abutting thereon.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the lot and tract of real property likely to be affected by the improvement is the parcel of land set forth after the above named street.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the assessment shall be divided into two (2) equal annual installments, which shall be payable under Plan One, collection by the County Treasurer, as set forth in 1967 SDCL 9-43-30 etc. e.g., and that all deferred installments shall bear interest at the rate of not more than ten (10%) percent per annum.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the contractors who undertake to perform the work of construction herein provided for shall be paid, in cash, from the sale of special assessment bonds.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any person interested may appear and show cause before the Governing Body of the City of Vermillion at the City Council Chambers of said City at 7:00 p.m. on the 6th day of July 2010, why the above and foregoing resolution should not, at said time and place, be adopted and passed by the Governing Body, at which time the Governing Body will finally approve, disapprove, or modify the same in its discretion.

Jen stated that the proposed ordinance creates a definition for snow fence and then regulates the use during November 1st through April 1st.
