#### 6. Old Business

##### A. South Crawford Road Settlement Agreements

John Prescott, City Manager, stated that the Crawford Road project started in 2006 after a citizen vote. Design plans were completed in 2007 and right-of-way acquisition started in 2008. The SD Department of Transportation completed an appraisal which was made available to the property owners. Negotiations continued with the property owners with a settlement reached with William and Robin Richardson in November 2009 and the remaining property owners agreed to the settlement today. The Stipulation and Final Judgment have been prepared by the City Attorney for the following four properties:

Mark Wetmore total acquisition and temporary easement of \$74,309.20 for Lot H1 of Lot BH of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$  SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 19, Township 92 North, Range 51 West of the 5<sup>th</sup> P.M. Clay County, South Dakota.

Robert R. Wharton total acquisition and temporary easement of \$16,846.40 for lot H1 of Lot 26, Block 1 of Ridgecrest No. 2 addition and Lot H1 of Lot 26A, Block 1 of Ridgecrest No. 6 Addition.

Jeffery and Virginia Johnson total acquisition and temporary easement of \$25,568.60 for Lot H1 of Lot 24A, Block 1, Ridgecrest No. 6 Addition.

Kathryn Marchum total acquisition and temporary easement of \$21,543.80 for Lot H1 of Lot 23A, Block 1, Ridgecrest No. 6 Addition.

Mayor Christopherson reported that the voters approved the road project and the City moved forward with completing the road while negotiating the acquisition of the right-of-way.

Jim McCulloch, City Attorney, reported that, following the SD DOT appraisal, the City proceeded with the quick take process by paying the appraised amount to the property owners with the courts providing the deeds to the right-of-way so construction could proceed. Negotiations continued and the Richardson's agreed to a settlement last fall and today the remaining property owners agreed to settle. Discussion followed.

#### 8. Public Hearings

A. Special daily malt beverage and wine license for Ribs, Rods & Rock'n Roll, Inc. on or about September 10 & 11, 2010 on West Main Street between High and Prospect Streets and Market Street from West Main Street to Kidder Street

Mike Carlson, Finance Officer, reported an application for a special daily malt beverage and wine license was received from Ribs, Rods & Rock'n Roll, Inc. on or about September 10 & 11, 2010 on West Main

Street between High and Prospect Streets, Market Street between Main and Kidder Streets and the Ratingen Platz. Mike stated that State statute and ordinance allow the City to include such conditions and restrictions, as the governing body may deem appropriate and consistent with state law. Some conditions to be considered would be: 1. Requiring a certificate of insurance naming the City of Vermillion as an additional insured, including liquor liability, 2. A Release and Indemnification releasing the City from liability for the event, 3. Require the applicant utilize a fenced areas where alcoholic beverages may be sold and consumed as well as a plan to monitor the entrances and exit from this area, 4. State law provides if an organization conducts a street dance in conjunction with a special event, the organization shall provide qualified security personnel as deemed necessary by the governing body. The Police Chief would recommend the organization provide at least six personnel with attire that states "Event Security" and reimburse the City for police office overtime wages limited to \$1,000, or actual costs, whichever is lower. 5. Require a plan for clean up and disposal for the event. 6. Enough portable restroom facilities for the attendees. 7. A listing of individuals selling alcohol and checking ID's be provided to the City Manager 24 hours before the event. 8. Hours of sales. Last year was 5:00 pm to 1 am on the first day and noon to 7:00 pm on the second, noting that the second day will need to be extended this year.

Kevin Annis and John Storm, representing Ribs, Rods & Rock'n Roll, Inc. reported that they planned the alcohol sales area the same as last year by fencing, carding, wristbands and clean up. They reported that they have met with the Chief of Police and understand what he wants from the group. Discussion followed on the hours of operation with Kevin noting that the hours start Friday at 5:00 pm ending at 1:00 am on Saturday and starting at noon on Saturday and ending at 1:00 am on Sunday, as the entertainment has extended into Saturday night.

- c. The applicant utilize a fenced area where alcoholic beverages may be sold and consumed, as well as a plan to monitor the entrances and exit from this area.
- d. That the Organization provides a minimum of 6 personnel that are at least age 21 to serve as security for the street dance. The individuals shall be wearing shirts that state "Event Security" on the back.
- e. The Organization agrees to reimburse the City of Vermillion for the overtime for police officers assigned to the event limited to \$1,000 or actual costs, whichever is lower.
- f. The Organization shall have a plan for clean up and provide adequate restroom facilities.
- g. The Organization shall provide to the City Manager a list of individuals that will be carding and selling alcoholic beverages at least 24 hours prior to the event. The list should indicate the age and level of training for each individual.
- h. The hours authorized for malt beverage and wine sales are 5:00 pm Friday to 1:00 am Saturday and noon Saturday to 1:00 am Sunday.

Alderman Osborne seconded the motion. Discussion followed on the event. Motion carried 8 to 0. Mayor Powell declared the motion adopted.

B. Permit to exceed permissible sound levels by no more than 50% for Ribs, Rods, and Rock'n Roll, Inc. on September 10 & 11, 2010 from 8:00 p.m. to 1:00 a.m. and September 11, 2010 from 5:00 p.m. to 1:00 a.m. for a street dance in the 200 block of West Main Street

Mike Carlson, Finance Officer, reported that an application was received to exceed the permissible sound levels by no more than 50% from Ribs, Rods & Rock'n Roll, Inc for a street dance on Main Street between High and Prospect Streets from 8:00 pm on Friday, September 10<sup>th</sup> to 1:00 am Saturday, September 11<sup>th</sup> and from 5:00 pm on Saturday, September 11<sup>th</sup> to 1:00 am on Sunday, September 13<sup>th</sup>. John Storm, representing the organization, answered questions of the Council on the sound levels noting that all the bands have been notified of the sound levels. John noted that they will be on site to monitor and make any adjustments with the bands.

Mike Carlson, Finance Officer, reported that an application for transfer of the package off sale malt beverage license was received from OMA SHREE, LLC for Speedee Mart transfer from Rite Way Oil & Gas Company, Inc. The Notice of Hearing and Police Chief's report are included in the packet. The new owner, Manjo Desai, is present if there are any questions. Manjo stated that he purchased the business and requested approval of the transfer noting that he was also applying for an on-off sale license for video lottery.

Farrel Christensen, Building Official, reported on the receipt of a special use permit application for a Day Care Center in an existing building at 905 W. SD Hwy 50 that is located in the extraterritorial area. The special use permit application, along with a site plan, building plan, fence plan, SD Department of Public Safety report and South Dakota Department of Heath report were included in the packet. The ordinance calls for a review and report by the Planning Commission and a public hearing before the City Council. Farrel reported that the Planning Commission reviewed the request and recommends approval, but suggested that the owner make application to have the property annexed into the city within one year.

Margo Logue stated she purchased the building to start a day care and has been approved by the State for all licenses. She requested approval of the special permit so that a building permit can be issued to make the needed renovations to the building.

Discussion followed with Margo answering questions of the City Council on the set back, fencing, traffic, including drop off and pickup up, and parking.

B. Street Closure Request - Portions of Main Street, Market Street, Center Street, Austin Street, Kidder Street, and Prospect Street in the downtown area on September 10 and 11, 2010 for Ribs, Rods, & Rock'n Roll events

John Prescott, reported a temporary street closing request was received from Ribs, Rods & Rock'n Roll to host the state BBQ Championship, music festival and car show on September 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup>. The request has been broken down into five sections as follows:

Section A - W. Main Street from the west side of the Prospect Street intersection west to the High Street and Market Street from the intersection with W. Main Street south to Bloomingdale Street be closed from 7:00 am Friday, September 10<sup>th</sup> until 12:00 pm on Sunday, September 12<sup>th</sup>.

Section B - Kidder Street from the alley just west of the Craig Thompson law office to the alley on the east side of

Total Flooring from 7:00 am Friday, September 10<sup>th</sup> until 12:00 pm on Sunday, September 12<sup>th</sup>.

Section C - W. Main Street from High Street to at least Austin Street and ending in an area deemed appropriate by the City from 5:00 pm Friday, September 10<sup>th</sup> until Noon on Saturday, September 11<sup>th</sup>. See comments below.

Section D - Austin Street from W. Main Street to Kidder, leaving the intersection of Austin and Kidder open, closed from 7:00 am Saturday, September 11<sup>th</sup> until 12:00 pm on Sunday, September 12<sup>th</sup>.
