4. Educational Session - Vermillion Chamber of Commerce & Development Company- Nate Welch

Nate Welch, Executive Director of the Vermillion Area Chamber of Commerce and Development Company, reviewed a summary of the VCDC operations noting that the City contribution of \$290,000 is allocated to administrative expenses for Bliss Pointe II and the increase support to local businesses. Nate reviewed the results of activities for the last year due to COVID-19 as well as how the organization is looking forward. Nate answered questions of the City Council on the activities of the VCDC.

Council Member Price moved approval of the amended July 19, 2021 special and regular session minutes. Council Member Humphrey seconded the motion. Motion carried 8 to 0. Mayor Collier-Wise declared the motion adopted.

Council Member Letellier read the proclamation recognizing Vermillion Water Utility staff for 20 years of drinking water excellence. Mayor Collier-Wise presented the proclamation to John to give to the Water Utility Staff.

7. Old Business

A. Second Reading of Ordinance 1438 to Rezone Lot 3, AMS Industrial Park Addition, City of Vermillion, Clay County, South Dakota, from NRC-Natural Resource Conservation District to the HI-Heavy Industrial District. (N. of 317th Street part of Heikes Tract 4, 17-92-52).

Stone Conley, City Management Assistant, reported that the City received a petition to rezone Lot 3, AMS Industrial Park Addition from Mr. Nick Slattery on behalf of AMS Building Systems (AMS), on June 29th. Stone stated that AMS is requesting that the property be rezoned from NRC Natural Resource Conservation District to HI Heavy Industrial. Stone noted that the district property is located north of 317th Street (part of Heikes Tract 4, 17-92-52). Stone stated that this property was annexed into the City on June 7, 2021 and when a property is annexed it is automatically placed in the NRC Natural Resource Conservation District. Stone noted that, at the July 19, 2021 meeting, the first reading of this ordinance was approved and no changes have been made.

Second reading of title to Ordinance No. 1438, entitled AN ORDINANCE to rezone Lot 3, AMS Industrial Park Addition, City of Vermillion, Clay County, South Dakota, from NRC-Natural Resource Conservation District to

the HI-Heavy Industrial District. (N. of 317th Street part of Heikes Tract 4, 17-92-52) for the City of Vermillion, South Dakota.

Mayor Collier-Wise read the title to the above named Ordinance, and Alderman Holland moved adoption of the following:

BE IT RESOLVED that the minutes of this meeting shall show that the title to the proposed Ordinance No. 1438 entitled Rezone Lot 3, AMS Industrial Park Addition, City of Vermillion, Clay County, South Dakota, from NRC-Natural Resource Conservation District to the HI-Heavy Industrial District. (N. of 317th Street part of Heikes Tract 4, 17-92-52) was first read and the Ordinance considered substantially in its present form and content at a regularly called meeting of the Governing Body on the 19th day of July, 2021 and that the title was again read at this meeting, being a regularly called meeting of the Governing Body on this 2nd day of August, 2021 at the City Hall Council Chambers in the manner prescribed by SDCL 9-19-7 as amended.

BE IT RESOLVED and ordained that said Ordinance be adopted to read as follows:

ORDINANCE 1438

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CITY OF VERMILLION CODE OF ORDINANCES TITLE XV LAND USAGE; CHAPTER 155, ZONING REGULATIONS; SECTION 155.026 ENTITLED ADOPTION OF OFFICIAL ZONING MAP, REZONING Lot 3, AMS INDUSTRIAL PARK ADDITION, CITY OF VERMILLION, CLAY COUNTY, SOUTH DAKOTA FROM THE NRC NATURAL RESOURCE CONSERVATION DISTRICT TO THE HI HEAVY INDUSTRIAL District

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Governing Body of the City of Vermillion, South Dakota that the Code of Ordinances Section 155.026, Adoption of Official Zoning Map, be amended as follows:

That Lot 3, AMS Industrial Park Addition, City of Vermillion, Clay County, South Dakota be hereby excluded from the NRC Natural Resource Conservation District and included in the HI Heavy Industrial District.

Motion carried 8 to 0. Mayor Collier-Wise declared that the Ordinance has been adopted and directed publication thereof as required by law.

## 8. New Business

A. Permit for consumption but not the sale of alcoholic beverages for Local Fare at the Fair sponsored by the Vermillion Area Farmers Market on Friday, August 13, 2021 from 4:30 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. at the Fairgrounds in Clover Hall

Katie Redden, Finance Officer, reported that Grace Freeman, on behalf of the Vermillion Area Farmers Market, has requested a permit to consume alcoholic beverages on public property for sampling of local wine and beer at the "Local Fare @ the Fair Sampling Event". Katie noted that the Local Fare at the Fair event will be on Friday, August 13th from 4:30 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. in Clover Hall. Katie noted that the City Council may permit the consumption, but not the sale, of alcoholic beverages on property owned by the public in which this is city property that is leased to Clay County for the fairgrounds.

B. Request to close Rose Street from Coyote Village to the Dakota Dome and Temporary Removal of Parking on Dakota Street from Alumni Street to the Hwy 50 Bypass for the USD Home Football Games

Cohl Turnquist, Administrative Intern, reported that USD has submitted a request to remove parking on Dakota Street from Alumni Street north to South Dakota Highway 50, and to close Rose Street from Coyote Village to the Sanford Coyote Sports Center for all five 2021 USD home football games. Cohl noted that, initially, the City received two separate street closure requests for both Rose Street and Dakota Street however, the requesting party clarified that the closure of the entirety of Dakota Street from Alumni Street to the Highway 50 Bypass would not be necessary. Cohl noted that the event would only require for the parking on Dakota Street to be removed.

#### C. Presentation of the 2022 Proposed Budget

John Prescott, City Manager, reported that, each year, the City staff prepares a proposed budget for the next fiscal year. John noted that the proposed budget documents for 2022 will be presented at the City Council meeting on Monday evening. John stated that this will provide the City Council time to review the document prior to the budget meetings. John noted that the actual discussion and presentation of the respective departmental budgets will take place on Monday, August 9 and Tuesday, August 10, 2021 in the Jack Powell Conference Room at City Hall starting at 5:30 p.m. each night.

John noted that the potential uncertainty of future impacts of COVID-19 and how the economy reacts over time continues to create uncertainty in preparing this budget proposal for 2022 in comparison to other years. John reported that several key projects will make a long-term difference for the community: funding for Prentis Park ballfield improvements, continued park improvements such as the Lions Campground project and park amenities, street repairs, and hike/bike path replacement are a few key projects for the upcoming budget year.

John noted that the budget was prepared with the assistance of all Departments Heads and many staff members from across the organization. Katie Redden, Stone Conley, Marty Washington, and Cohl Turnquist were very instrumental in the development of the proposed 2022 budget.

#### D. Business Improvement District #1 Board Appointment

Kelsey Collier- Wise, Mayor, reported that the City received one BID #1 application to fill the open position. Kelsey noted that this was from Judy Benson the co-owner of Circle 13. Kelsey reported that the by-laws require that one seat be designated for a hotel/motel owner or manager.
